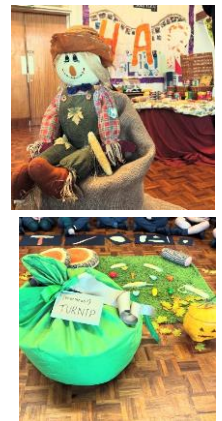
Cabbages and squash
