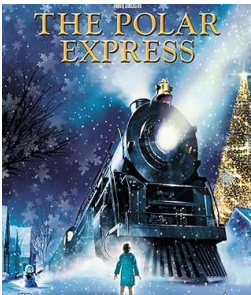
Dates for your diary!
